From November 2–4, 2022, AEI will launch the first in a new series of events called FREE Forums, inspired by Ian Rowe's scholarship. The first FREE Forum will take place at the Westin in Birmingham, Alabama, drawing on the city's rich history as a center of the Civil Rights Movement and an example of a new era of dynamism in America's mid-sized cities.

Motivated by a desire to help young people in struggling communities thrive, FREE Forums will help inspire leaders who can reinvigorate the critical institutions that develop agency in America's youth: Family, Religion, Education, and Entrepreneurship. FREE Forum Birmingham will bring together 150 local and national leaders representing the policy, nonprofit, and business community, alongside hand-selected community service providers, offering an introduction to relevant scholarship in each area of the FREE framework and providing participants opportunities to identify promising strategies and interventions in their home region.
